Day 1 - 4 | Okavango Delta



Area Overview

The Okavango Delta is the largest intact inland delta in the world, and is exceptionally rich in wildlife. Situated deep within the Kalahari Basin, the Delta is characterized by meandering deep water channels lined with papyrus reeds that open up into larger lagoons and islands; these in turn give way to seasonal floodplains and eventually large tracts of dry land where animals congregate. Fed by the Okavango River and rains from the highlands of Angola, the Delta can vary in size from 15,000 sq km (5,800 sq mi) during drier periods to a staggering 22,000 sq kms (8,500 sq mi) during wetter periods.

The game viewing depends on season, floodwaters and food availability but it is one of the most sought after wilderness destinations in the world. In addition to big game viewing, visitors come to experience the supreme tranquility and serenity of an untouched delta, and scenes of extraordinary natural beauty. It consistently produces very good predator action with considerable herds of ungulates and elephants, as well as a reintroduced (predominantly white) rhino population.



Day 1 - 4 | Gomoti Plains Camp



Property Overview

Gomoti Plains Camp is named after the nearby Gomoti River, with roaming flood plains based on either side of the camp interspersed with towering palm trees. The camp has been built using iconic signature Machaba style tents, with a design reflective of water and land, both essential to life in the Okavango Delta.

Experience & Activities

Gomoti Plains Camp offers extensive water activities with incredible wildlife diversity. The wildlife viewing in the area, both from vehicle or water, is superb. Guests can look forward to mokoro trips, motor boats (water dependant), and game viewing by vehicle and on foot. Being in a private concession, guests can also enjoy night drives and off-road viewing.

Some of the more interesting finds in this unique area include wild dog dens, large prides of lions, big herds of buffalo, recent sightings of leopard and cheetah, as well as plentiful other wildlife throughout the area.

There is no WiFi in the tents or main areas. Limited WiFi can be accessed near the office.



Day 4 - 6 | Chobe National Park



Area Overview

Chobe National Park is located in northern Botswana in easy driving distance to Kasane and Victoria Falls. Chobe is Botswana's first designated national park and, at over 11,700 km2 (4,500 mi2), is one of the largest. The greater Chobe area consists of the Chobe River, Savute, and Linyanti, which combined is home to Africa's largest elephant population.

There is a rich variety of landscapes in addition to the famed riverfront including vast floodplains, woodlands, grasslands, and clay pans which can be enjoyed by boating safaris and game drives.



Day 4 - 6 | Ngoma Safari Lodge



Property Overview

Ngoma Safari Lodge is a boutique lodge offering unrivalled panoramic views over the game-rich floodplain and Chobe River. It is on the doorstep of Chobe National Park, also known as the "Land of the Giants," home to the largest population of elephants on Earth.

Ngoma Safari Lodge is sensitively designed to celebrate its pristine location and views while blending into its natural surroundings. The thatch-roofed lodge is finished in volcanic rock that naturally occurs in the Chobe Forest Reserves and its suites nestle in bush willow thickets and Zambezi teak trees.

Lion, leopard, buffalo, and elephant are very often seen, while hippo, crocodile, giraffe, sable, and roan antelope also call the Chobe Forest Reserve home. The flood plain also attracts large migratory herds of zebra that follow a 300 miles round trip between the Angola basin and Chobe, making it the longest terrestrial migration route in Africa.

Experience & Activities

Expect a vast and diverse array of wildlife as knowledgeable guides take you on safaris through the Chobe National Park, lazy afternoons by the pool, and stunning dinners under African stars.



Day 4 - 6 | Ngoma Safari Lodge

The expansive Chobe River can be explored in the comfort of a river cruise boat. This full-day safari is a wonderful way in which to absorb and appreciate the scale and splendour of this all-important water system and the many magnificent life forms it supports.

Accommodations

Suite

All eight thatched river-facing suites have spacious internal and external living areas, a large luxury bath, an inside and outside shower, air conditioning, overhead fans, mini bar, and tea/coffee facilities including a Nespresso machine. In addition, each suite has a private "refresh and relax" pool conveniently located in the external living area. All rooms are equipped with three-quarter beds that can be converted to a king size bed.

Day 6 - 7 | Victoria Falls



Area Overview

The town of Victoria Falls lies on the southern banks of the Zambezi River at the western edge of the falls that it is named after. After David Livingstone set his eyes on the "smoke that thunders" in 1855, the settlement was later developed in 1901 when the possibility of using the waterfall for hydro-electric power was explored, and expanded when the railway from Bulawayo reached the town shortly before the Victoria Falls Bridge was opened in April 1905, connecting Southern Rhodesia (later Rhodesia; now Zimbabwe) to Northern Rhodesia (later Zambia).

Vic Falls, as it is affectionately abbreviated to, is known as the adventure capital of Africa, with any number of outdoor and adventure activities to choose from. As well as world-class white water rafting, there is one of the world's highest bungee jumps, skydiving, swing slides, helicopter rides and more.

Although the town is small, it has a vibrant feel to it with lots of craft shops, pop up craft breweries and cafes, and relies heavily on tourism.



Day 6 - 7 | The Palm River Hotel



Property Overview

The vision for the Palm River Hotel was simultaneously simple and complex: a unique hotel offering unparalleled luxury without compromising a sense of home comfort; vast, unimpeded views which maintained shelter and privacy; the convenience of a central location preserved within a tranquil bubble of peace and quiet. The hotel's location could not be more idyllic, situated as it is along the banks of the iconic Zambezi River, among towering indigenous trees and only 4 km from Africa's natural world wonder, Victoria Falls – so close, in fact, that on a clear, quiet day you can hear the thunder and see the spray of the mighty waterfall from your room.

The restaurant, located in the main structure, with a large al fresco dining area under a canopy of trees, has stunning garden views sweeping down to the Zambezi River. The cuisine reflects the natural setting, using fresh, local ingredients to create unique fusion fare.

Set under a canopy of trees in the main area, the outdoor bar serves a selection of local and imported beverages, wines, cocktails, specialty coffees, and fresh fruit juices daily.



Day 6 - 7 | The Palm River Hotel

A 20m infinity pool in the foreground of the main area merges with the horizon and offers a cool oasis under the shade of towering trees. At night, the pool area transforms into a starlit wonderland, with the use of cleverly illuminated rocks and lighting.

Built on the edge of the Zambezi River, the deck is the perfect spot to take in the mighty river and view its wealth of animal and bird life.

Deemed Africa's Adventure capital, Victoria Falls has everything to offer for travellers looking to fulfil their adrenaline bucket list including scenic helicopter flights above the Falls, highwire activities over the 120m gorge or white-water rafting the rapids below the World Wonders Waterfall. Immerse yourself within one of five National Parks located within 100km of Victoria Falls, and enjoy game viewing enclosed by untouched wilderness.

A complimentary shuttle bus runs on a regular basis throughout the day to transport guests between The Palm River Hotel and Victoria Falls Town, stopping at the key landmarks for guests' convenience: the Victoria Falls Rainforest, Ilala Lodge Hotel and the various craft markets.
